EXHIBITION INAUGURATES NEW ONLINE GALLERY DEDICATED TO THE SONIC ARTS

On February 21 an exciting new online gallery dedicated to the sonic arts will be inaugurated by the opening of an exhibition entitled *Clickanywhere*. The exhibition, curated by Salomé Voegelin for CRiSAP (Creative Research into Sound Arts Practice) can be found at http://clickanywhere.crisap.org/. It will bring together works from ten diverse artists to produce a series of sonic spaces.

The artists represented in *Clickanywhere* are of different ages, nationalities, backgrounds and creative practices. The works, however, all use voice to address and engage the visitor. Sometimes the voice is that of the artist, for example Richard Brautigan reading from his work *Trout Fishing in America* or Clare Gasson narrating her own script for a film that never existed. Some times the visitor 'eavesdrops' on a conversation as in Johannes Maier's piece *Vali and Ameneh* and in others the visitor is left to hear their own response as artists such as Douglas Park and David Mollin write the voice. Most of the works tell some kind of story and all explore in some way the intersection between the sonic and the visual.

The new gallery part of CRiSAP (Creative Research in Sound Arts Practice), a University of the Arts research unit dedicated to the exploration of sound as an artistic practice. CRiSAP aims to produce, commission and curate new work and invigorate the interpretative context that surrounds sound art and performance through seminar series, symposia, performances, research studentships and publications. CRiSAP is based at London College of Communication.

The launch of Clickanywhere will take place at 6 pm on February 21, 2007 at the Research Gallery at the London College of Communication, Elephant and Castle, SE1. The curator Salomé Voegelin will introduce the show.
